Hi Guys, please tell our readers about yourself...

The Dung Beatles are not your average Beatles tribute band. We don't dress up in Sgt Peppers uniforms and we include in our set some of the more challenging, less well known (but still amazing) tracks from the classic albums such as "Revolver" and "Rubber Soul".

Since re-launching our "career" in January 2013 we have performed around forty gigs, including sell outs at local theatres, live broadcasts on BBC Three Counties Radio, featured in articles and videos in "The Bucks Herald", and raised thousands of pounds in support of charities including Arts4Every1, British Heart Foundation, Florence Nightingale Hospice, Royal Brompton and Harefield Hospital.

What has been your biggest highlight so far this year?

Our 2014 gig highlights include The Cavern, Liverpool, "A Hard Day's Night" 50th anniversary festival at "The Turk's Head" pub, Twickenham (scene from the film of "Ringo's Walk"), and an appearance at Beaconfest on the main stage. On Valentine's Day we featured as guest performers, alongside comedian Harry Enfield, at The Royal Brompton and Harefield charity's main annual fund raising event.

Which bands are you following at the moment? Who would you recommend we (and our readers) should check out?

We have a close association with our friends in two other bands; "SkaSouls UK" and "The Notations". Although we are normally a four piece band, especially for HOTC we are very pleased to have with us special guest and "fifth Dung Beatle" Rob Schafer, from "SkaSouls UK", on keyboards.
